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Making the Most of Moodle

This session will offer a practical overview of some of Moodle's best features for engaging discussions and active learning. Whether you plan to use Moodle merely as a repository for class materials or as the main delivery platform for your courses, there is definitely more that can be done with Moodle. I will provide practical examples of how I use Moodle to facilitate a constructivist framework to learning, using the eLearning tools for education rather than merely training. Since its inception, Moodle was built around these theories, and its creator, Martin Dougiamas, has explicitly stated that Moodle was designed to promote meaningful and interactive learning experiences. I will also demonstrate how to build quizzes and tests, and even how to create online workshops for assignments.
